


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What an incredible year of change and growth at South Vancouver Family Place Society. As I reflect on another successful year, I am filled with gratitude for the dedication of our staff, volunteers, and funders. It is through their ongoing support, dedication and commitment that we continue to provide strength-based services and programs dedicated to supporting families with young children in our community. A sense of community belonging nurtures us all and I am happy that SVFP has being building community connections and wellness for over 43 years now.

2018/2019 saw new funding from the Ministry of Children and Family Development providing one more day of programming in the River District and enhanced programming at the main site including the food and garden program on Wednesdays and the Parent/Infant Drop In.

In 2018, as part of the Provincial Government's Early Care and Learning Recruitment and Retention Strategy, the KidsCare Preschool Early Childhood Educators (ECEs) received the wage enhancement benefit. This is an important step in the recognition of the valuable work of licensed early childhood educators in our community and the important role they play in a child's development.

We continue to see increasing number of families with young children accessing our services and programs with each year that passes. The impact of the services SVFP provides is hard to measure but we know from the words of our participants that we do make a difference.

I, sadly, had to step down from my position as Executive Director in May 2019. I am grateful for all the support and love from the staff, volunteers and families at SVFP and have such fond memories of my 3 years as part of this loving family. However; I am extremely happy that SVFP is now in the hands of Julio Bello who brings a wealth of experience in the sector as well as a loving dad of 2 children.

Message from the Chair

Firstly, it has been an honour and a privilege to serve the South Vancouver Family Place as a member of the board and as chairperson for the last 6 years. I thank all the members, the stakeholders, community partners, funders, and everyone who shares this space, for their commitment to this organization and the community at large. As outgoing chair I wish to share a little about what the family place has done for me personally. Ultimately it is our common experiences that bring us together and I hope that many of you will hear in my own an echo of your own story.

I first came to the family place as a young mother; my daughter was a year and a half and I was struggling. I didn't have a sense of community, my foundation was rocky. I knew that I wanted to be the best mother I could be but I was so very tired, and lost in doubt and fear.

The family place gave me a sense of stability. I grew to love the structure and consistency of its programmes while also revelling in the care and familiarity of its welcoming centre. I took workshops which allowed me to speak about my fears of failure in a non-judgmental environment, and I took classes that allowed me to better understand the inner workings of my little human's mind.

But it was when I was asked to volunteer for the board that I gained so much. That leap of faith in my abilities gave me a confidence and courage it would take me many years to fully appreciate. I was able to give back to the community that had given so freely to me, which fostered in me a sense of purpose and pride. I felt entrusted with this precious responsibility, to help ensure everyone who needs it, everyone who feels as lost as I did, can find the support and safety of this beautiful space.

I will be forever in the debt of the loving, kind, compassionate and caring employees of the South Vancouver Family Place.

The SVFP has gone through some big changes over the last year. Our executive director, Kimberley Berger, resigned for health reasons and I thank her deeply for her service. We are grateful and excited to welcome our new ED and I look forward to getting to know him better and look forward to working with him in the future. I know no matter what changes we go through our core values and mission does not waver, we are here to serve the community around us, by fostering healthy relationships between children and their caregivers.

I have tried the Strong Start program as well and must say that, as the mother of a 2 year old, it cannot compare. Perhaps I'll feel differently when my daughter is older and I want her to prepare for kindergarten but, for now, SVFP has our vote!

I was trying to explain the difference to a friend - that SVFP is more relaxed and friendly. I couldn't really put my finger on it, but then one day I heard Renee describing it and she put into words what I was trying to say: Strong Start has an academic goal, but the SVFP has the goal of "community".

Simple, but what a difference it makes! Their goal of community trickles down to those who attend and can be seen in the way that parents introduce themselves to newcomers and get to know each other.

Now Strong Start is a wonderful and needed program but, when my daughter and I attended, we felt very out of place. I was one of only two people speaking English and none of the other parents/grandparents bothered trying to include us.

At SVFP, however, even when we don't speak the same language, other moms and grandparents will still "communicate" - smiling and nodding as our kids play side by side. And Renee, Ingrid and Eva are always circulating and bringing people into conversation with each other or stopping to ask how we're doing.

So a big thank you to all the SVFP staff (my apologies if I'm forgetting some).



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
