Project #71: Rocks and Sculptures!

- Gather various sizes of rocks; choose some with flat stable bases.
- Create a rock formation by stacking the rocks.
- Use some of your rocks for painting as Stamps.
- Stamp Pad: Paper towels on a plastic tray. Pour some non-toxic liquid paint onto the paper towel. Allow to soak in and then smooth it out evenly to make a damp stamp pad. Not too much paint as it will be too dripping and the stamp pad will not work very well.
- Using a variety of your rocks, press onto “Stamp Pad” and then use the damp rock to create a design onto construction paper.
- When done, add some sparkles if you like.
- When everything is dry, think of ideas of what to draw on your painting..... Could be scenery, community, sky, clouds or other nature type ideas. Add cotton, straw, string
- Use your painted and plain rocks to create a tower of rocks balancing carefully. Try different rock formations.

Outing: Go for a walk and gather various sizes of rocks. The River Front has a great stock of rocks on the river bank. Wash them thoroughly. Use them for your designs, towers, buildings and art. When done with them, please wash them and return them to the area where you got them. They are for the environment.
