### Project # 80: Fall Leaf Booklet

- Fold a few pieces of construction paper in half. Staple the edge to form a booklet.
- Make the cover/title page by designing it as shown or make up your own idea. Have the children print their own name or even parts of it. (letters may be backwards or upside down and that is perfectly normal to start).
- On flatten out the pages inside the booklet to make it easy to turn the pages.
- Children can draw their own leaves.
- Have some sample leaves on the table to view. Note the details on the real leaves.
- Find some leaf pictures from magazines. Cut and glue into your booklet.
- Add more details to the pages as the child likes
- Try some leaf stamps such as pressing a leaf onto a paper towel lightly soaked in paint to make prints in your booklet.
- Make some fall trees on a page....

#### Activity:

Practice cutting with scissors. Cut out leaf shapes or just practice snipping paper shapes. Add this to your booklet. Smaller pieces of paper are easier for young toddlers and children to hold and get better control over. Snipping is good to start. Remember the leaves and paper snips can be any shape!
