Project #100: Snakes!

- Gather some paper towel rolls. Old pasta can be used as well but generally we do not use foods for art as it is wasteful.
- Cut them into small cylinders, divide them into 4 pieces to create snake pieces.
- On a firm piece of paper such as poster board or construction paper, glue them onto in a snake shape, placing the sections in a squiggly pattern.
- You may want to draw a squiggly snake shape onto your paper first and glue the sections onto the lines.
- Add some paint to the various sections.
- Draw, paint or use sticker eyes for the head of the snake.
- Add a fork tongue.
- Maybe add some grass drawings to your picture.
- Add some rock shapes.
- Think of other details.
- Sand could be used on your thick paper as well.

Activity: Go to the Zoo. Go to a pet store. You may find some snakes in some heated sections. Talk about snakes as they are cold blooded and need the warmth of the lights. Read some stories. Compare snake sizes and types. Many snakes are poisonous but some are not.
