Project #199: Faces

- On a plain piece of paper, sponge paint an oval shape.
- Let this dry a bit and then add some hair with a smaller sponge dipping it into liquid Tempera Paint.
- Add some facial details when this is all dry.
- Add some texture by gluing on some wool or string for part of the hair.
- Stickers for eyes can be used for the younger toddlers.
- Make many different types of faces for your family and friends.
- Use various colours for various skin types.
- Add some hats for various themes such as winter, fall, spring, summer, circus, cowboy etc.
- If children are able, add the body to your face starting with the neck.
- You may also like to use the faces you made to cut them out and attach them to a hanger or wooden stick with string for a mobile.
