Project #202: Fall Leaves

- Cut out various shapes of large leaves. (they don't have to be perfect)
- Cut out some smaller leaves. Save all small scraps.
- Rip up some tissue paper in various sizes.
- Children can then design the large leaf in any way they like.
- Start by using some felt markers or crayons to draw on the large leaf.
- Then using a glue stick spread the glue all over the large leaf.
- Add some small leaves, paper scraps of various colours and some crumpled or smooth tissue paper.
- You may also want to use some natural leaf pieces from the leaves that fall from the trees.
- You may want to add a few thin twigs is another idea.
- Be creative and the children will design their own leaf.
- Older children may want to put in the lines of the leaf as you will note on the one sample attached.
- Bingo dabbers also work well to colour your leaf. Blend the colour as you stamp with them.

Activity:

Go for a Fall walk and notice the leaves on the ground and there maybe falling from the trees as you walk. Observe the colours. Ask children the colours. Maybe a good day would be on a "Windy Day"
