### **Project #216: Ghosts!**

- Cut out a ghost shape in any way you like.
- Add some eyes and a mouth with your felt markers or crayons.
- Try using some shapes for eyes and mouth. Simple oval shapes are great to use!
- Fill in the details of eyes and mouth as you like.
- Add some white cotton or tissue paper to your ghost shape by gluing it down with a glue stick. It is best for young children to cover the ghost shape with the glue and then stick the items onto the ghost. If you have them place the glue stick onto the cotton or tissue it with just stick to the glue stick. This is quite frustrating to the young children as well and makes their work into an unneeded "Chore:."
- Try adding some sparkles to your ghost.
- Make a scene for your ghost such as a haunted house or trees, dark night etc.
- Make various sizes of the ghosts.
- Think about making a mobile of ghosts.
