Project #236 Christmas Wreaths

- Using a paper plate, cut the center out to create your wreath shape.
- Punch holes around the circle edge with a hole puncher.
- Thread thin wrapping ribbon in and out of the holes creating an overlap or weaved look around the edges.
- Decorate your wreath with a variety of materials such as felt markers, crayons, stickers, sparkle or even some paint or bingo dabbers. Younger toddlers and Preschoolers love the Bingo Dabbers. Do this first and let it dry if they like this. Then you may add more details to it with other ideas if you like.
- Cotton is another idea for a snowy wreath.
- You can also use some cedar branches to attach with the ribbon or possibly non-toxic white glue. (let dry while wreath is laying down)
- Think about adding a bow to the top and a small string to hang them up.
- Display your child's wreath as it is their own creativity. Let them be free to enjoy creating it themselves. It is their idea so let them be free to explore and create!

Activity:

Go for a walk and you may see various wreaths on the doors of homes. If you are in a condo or apartment, you will probably notice wreaths on the doors as well
