Project #240: Igloo Art

- Make an igloo shape from white paper as shown in the photo.
- Glue the igloo shape onto construction paper. Let children choose the colour of the construction paper. Older Toddlers and Preschoolers can practice cutting by cutting the igloo shape out too. It does not have to be perfect as it is the child's art. Process not Product!
- Add line details with a felt marker or crayons.
- Another idea would be to cut out some squares of white paper and glue them onto your igloo shape.
- Add some cotton. Stretch the cotton and apply with a glue stick. Put the glue stick on the paper, not the cotton!
- Add some white paint with small Q Tips. When that is dry, you could then draw some lines onto the paper and add your small cotton snow pieces.
- Think about something that may go into the igloo and draw it.
- Stickers could be used for the Character/s inside the doorway of your igloo.
- Add some sparkles for fun. These can be sprinkled onto the wet paint if you are painting.
- Draw some more details around your igloo such as trees, birds, rocks, more snow etc. Chalk can be used nicely on construction paper.

Activity: Read books on igloos and look at real pictures of igloos. Feel some ice cubes so the children know it is a cold structure!
