### **Project #257 Scotty Dog!**

- Create a scotty dog shape and cut out.
- Add details to your Scotty Dog with felt markers, crayons or pencils.
- Next dab some white paint onto the Scotty dog shape.
- Using a Qtip, make swirly lines into the white paint spreading it all over your dog shape.
- Try Bingo Dabbers as the younger children and Toddlers really enjoy the Dabbing Motion.
- If you would rather not use paint, try some glue with some wool of various colours.
- Be creative as the wool, string, jute or other string type threads can be used to glue onto the Dog Shape.
- Use non-toxic white childrens glue for glueing the wool, string etc as it will adhere to the paper better.
- If you would also like to try making a thinner cardboard (cereal box) Scotty Dog shape, try it. Older children may be able to cut these out as well.
- Try glueing some felt or fabric pieces onto your cardboard shape using the non-toxic white glue. Be free about the colours the children use as this is their project and the dog can be any colour/s they choose.
