Ann's Creative Corner Project #278: Decorated Easter Eggs

- Fold construction paper in half lengthwise and create an egg shape on the fold. If you need to adjust it, cut more around the curves of bottom and top to gain the egg shape.
- Make a variety of sizes. One piece of construction paper can make two smaller eggs so as to save on paper and waste.
- All remaining scraps of various colours can be used to decorate your egg shape as well. Use a glue stick to glue on random shapes.
- Try using a felt pen to add some details to your egg.
- Sparkles are nice for the egg. Try liquid sparkles or a glue stick with a sprinkle of sparkles. Liquid sparkles may be easier and more smooth for younger children and toddlers.
- Give the children a few stickers to add to the egg/s.
- Glue your egg onto another piece of paper or punch a hole in the top for threading a string or ribbon through it to hang up.
- Try using some stamps with a stamp pad.

Activity: Go shopping and see the variety of egg shapes. Go for a local walk and see if you can find egg shaped rocks.. Maybe there are flowers that are egg Shaped. Are there some clouds that look like egg shapes... Boil some eggs at home for 10-15 minutes until they are hard boiled. Let them cool off. Paint them with food colouring or dip them..... Watch the colours change.
