Project #298: Frogs!

- Cut out a frog shape or buy premade shapes.
- Add some details such as the eyes and mouth of your frog.
- Add details to the feet and body such as toes, and scales for your frog.
- Crumple up small pieces of green or brown tissue paper and scrunch into small balls.
- With a glue stick, cover your frog in various areas.
- Stick the crumpled tissue paper onto the frog to give it a scaley look.
- Try adding some coarse sand or salt to give it a rough look.
- For the eyes, you may want to use sticker eyes or googly eyes with your glue stick. However, it is more creative to draw the eyes by hand. These can be as simple as a dot or rough circle for the younger children.
- Try some bubble paper as it would give the frog a nice texture. Children also have fun popping the bubbles before or after placing them on the frog. This is great for fine motor control too! As well as Fun to Do!

Activity:

Look for a pond with lily pads in it and you may see some frogs! Be very quiet and observe. They may be looking at you. Sometimes you may find them hopping in from lily pad to lily pad. Sometimes they may be hopping in the grass close to the pond. There are frogs in an area in Everett Crowley Park on the south end ponds.
