Ann's Creative Corner Project #357: Remembrance Day Poppy!

- Create a poppy shape from red construction paper.
- Cut out a black circle for the Center of the poppy
- Use some scraps of paper (such as the Black left over pieces) and cut some thin strips of paper to fit the inside of the poppy.
- Children can colour the poppy with Felt markers or crayons in any way they like.
- Using a glue stick the children can place the black circle into the Centre of the Poppy.
- Encourage children to draw some lines from the Centre of poppy to the edges.
- Add some strips of paper to give it more detail (shown in photo)
- Think of other things you may like to add to your poppy such as tissue paper, sparkle glue or sparkles!
- Attach a straw or stick to the bottom of the poppy if you like.

Activity:

Go for a walk in a store area and purchase a poppy from the vendors outside or inside the stores. If children are old enough to understand, you may like to talk about the meaning of the Poppy for Remembrance Day. Look up the poem "In Flanders Fields".
