- Using a nice colourful non toxic Paint, paint your child's palm of the hand.
- Press down carefully onto a piece of construction paper and press firmly. Try making both hands if the child does not like this.
- If the child does not want to have their hand painted, try tracing the hand/s
- Once you have the print done, sprinkle the wet paint with some sparkles or use a glue stick if the hand/s have been traced and then sprinkle it with sparkles.
- You may find a template online with a nice frame or poem on it for the print paper.
- Add some more decorations to your handprint page if you like. Some of the older children could look at the details of their hands and add the finger nails for example......
