Project #449: Volcanos!

- Please provide clear plastic cups, white vinegar, baking soda, small spoons and lots of paper towels or clothes.
- Place a clear plastic cup onto a bed of paper towels or cloth.
- Pour in some white vinegar to about ¼ full.
- Children can use a small teaspoon to scoop some "BAKING SODA" (not baking powder).
- Children can then pour the baking soda into the cup and see what happens!
- This will bubble up with the gas that the vinegar and baking soda create.
- Try adding some food colouring to your vinegar for a variation.
- Try adding a few light weight sparkles.......
- Talk about what happened as the vinegar and baking soda creates a "Gas of bubbles"

Activity: Prior to this experiment, go to the store to purchase the items needed. Vinegar and baking soda are not too costly. Or if you have some at home that is great. Talk about other uses for these items. Baking soda is used to bake cookies to make the "Rise", vinegar is in sauces and salad dressings, vinegar on french fries
