Ann's Creative Corner Project #469: Big Big Turnip!

- Create a large turnip shape out of brown construction paper (or others colours if you like)
- Children can colour this with felt markers, crayons or paint!
- You may also like to add some "Texture" to this by adding some tissue paper or other types of smooth or textured paper....
- Encourage some curved lines on the Turnip shape.
- Make a garden of smaller turnips.
- Add some scenery such as the area around the garden plus some other vegetables in the garden.
- Also some turnip shaped stamps or sponges would make a nice printed creation.

Activity: Purchase a Turnip from a market (with children if possible)
Cut it open (adults only as turnips are very hard)
Show the children the inside and discuss what it looks like.
Cook the turnip after the ADULT peels and cuts it.
Add some butter if you like and salt.
Share it with your children
