Project #474: Halloween Bats!

- Out of black or brown construction paper, create a bat shape. Be Sure to make it large enough for the children to have fun being creative in their design!
- Add some details with some lines on the wings, eyes, mouth or any detailing the children like to do.
- Try using a glue stick and sparkles or liquid sparkle glue.
- Tissue paper crumpled up would make a nice texture.
- Try some liquid white paint with a QTip as this would be easy and creative for Toddlers and Preschool age children.
- If you like, place your bat on another piece of dark blue paper to create the night sky. Add some stars and the moon with gold sparkles, stickers or draw them.
- Make a mobile of bats if you would like to make a few smaller bats. When done colouring and putting details on the smaller bats. Let them dry and use a hole punch to punch a hole into your creation.
- Bats can be hung upside down too as that is the way they sleep!

Chant or felt story: Five Little Bats

Five little bats flying in the air. One flew away and then there were four!
Four little bats hanging upside down. One woke up & then there were 3!
Three little bats eating a peach. One got mad and began to screech!
