Ann's Creative Corner Project #691: Lady Bugs!

- Cut the head and body shape of a ladybug.
- Maybe ladybugs are red or orange but you may like to make various colours.
- Cut some legs for this as well.
- Cut some wing shapes as well to add to the body by gluing them onto the ladybug. The wings may fan out if the child likes to do that.
- Supply some small circles to glue onto the body of your ladybug.
- Children may glue the head and body together to start or you may have it already attached.
- Glue six legs onto the ladybug and express that they are an insect which has six legs.
- The circle may be glued onto the body.
- You may also like to add the feelers or antennae to the head..
- Supply some felt markers as well for the children to add their own ideas.
- The children may add the eyes by drawing them onto the ladybug
- Sticker eyes or googly eyes may also be used. (be careful of googly eyes as they can be a choking hazard for toddlers and young children)

Activity: Search for ladybugs in your area. They are often seen in the long grass or on the trunk of trees. Note that they do have wings. Song: "Oh Lady Bug Oh Lady Bug"
