Ann's Creative Corner Project #752: Squirrels and Hibernation!

- Cut out the shape of a Squirrel from Brown or Black Construction paper.
- Provide children with Felt Markers and Crayons
- Provide some chalk or non-toxic oil pastel crayons.
- Provide some short cut pieces of wool or string of various earth tones.
- Children can draw facial features, toe and finger features.
- The wool or string can be used to cover parts of the squirrels body, especially the bushy tail.
- Add a paper nut to the Squirrels paws to appear that the Squirrel is collecting nuts.
- If you like, glue the Squirrel onto a poster board and add scenery details such as trees and shrubs.
- This can make a great group project.

There are many squirrels gathering food for the winter. Notice the various colours. Notice the trees they climb. Watch them hunt and scurry around for food to store.
