Ann's Creative Corner Project #754: Thanksgiving Turkeys!

- Cut out a turkey shape from construction paper.
- Provide some feathers for children to glue onto the turkey shape.
- If you do not have feathers, cut some feather shapes from a variety of colours of construction paper. Cut slits into the feather shape to make it look like a feather.
- Children may draw the eye or eyes onto their Turkey Shape.
- Provide some orange felt markers to colour in the beak and the feet.
- Provide some small pieces of the feet shapes and/or beak shapes to glue onto the Turkey shapes if you like.
- Children can use a glue stick to cover the tail part of the turkey and then lay the feathers or feather shapes onto the tail.
- If you have some Sticker Eyes, the younger toddlers may like to use these as well.
- Make a
- Turkey body shape from construction paper and add some feathers to the back part as shown. Add some paper feet too!

Activity: Visit a petting zoo as they may have some turkeys to view. A country farm is a great place that may have turkeys running freely in a caged pen area. They are not touchable and not to be petted so be aware of this.
