Project #758: Turnips!

- Cut out a turnip shape.
- Cut out a leaf stem for the top of the turnip.
- Turnips can be beige, brown, purple and orange.
- Glue the stem onto the turnip.
- Draw some circular lines from side to side of the turnip to give it a depth look.
- Add some details to your turnip with some flat tissue paper of various earth tones.
- Make a turnip collage if you can use some magazine or calendar photos.
- Draw the garden for the turnip.
- Buy some turnip seeds to have a look at size and shape.
- These can be used in your art project as well.

Activity: Turnip Cooking!

Turnips are very hard so must be peeled and cut carefully by an adult. When you have the pieces small enough the children may help put them into a large pot. Cover them with some water but just enough to cover them. Slowly simmer the turnip pieces until soft and mushy. Mash them with a masher. You may like to add some brown sugar and some butter to this as well as turnips are quite sharp tasting. Enjoy eating!
