Project #807: St Patrick's Day Clover!

- Cut out some green clover leaf shapes of various sizes.
- There can be 3 leaf clovers or 4 leaf clovers. The 4 leaf clovers are lucky if you can find them!
- Children may draw on these with crayons and felt markers.
- Try using some sponge painting with various shades of green paint.
- Add some tissue paper to your wet paint if you would like to see the green tissue paper reflect the colour of the paint. Note how the colours change with the various paint shades and tones.
- Try using only tissue paper on your clover leaf by glueing flat pieces of the clover and some scrunched pieces onto the clover.
- Make a collage of many clovers.
- Try making a mobile of smaller clovers.
- Do this by cutting out some smaller clover shapes from a poster board. Punch holes to thread a short string through an then tie the clover onto a branch or stick or straw etc to create a mobile.
- Add another short string to the top to hang this mobile.

Activity: "Go on a Clover Walk"

Walk in nature and search for clovers in fields and gardens. See the various shades of green. Find a lucky one (4 leaf) if you can!
