Project #818: Easter Eggs!

- Hard Boil some real eggs.
- Let cool.
- Prepare some colourful water by using food colouring in water in some small plastic bowls.
- Be sure to use a well covered surface and avoid the food colouring and coloured water from touching the surface of the tables or your clothing.
- Old towels and newspapers would be good on the tables with a sheet of plastic such as a plastic table cloth are a good idea.
- In trays, you may place the various bowls of colours. Put one colour in each tray.
- When your Hard Boiled Egg is cool, write your name on it with crayons and place it on a spoon or in a small dipping type sifter.
- Children may dip the egg into one colour.
- Then they may like to dip it in another colour or colours.
- Let it dry!
- Keep the egg in the fridge to keep it fresh.
- When you are ready to eat it, you may peel the shell off and enjoy eating the egg.
- For those children who do not eat eggs, a paper egg is another option. Provide paper egg shapes made from construction paper and decorate with shapes, drawings, stickers or stamps. Tissue paper is nice to see the colours change too.

Activity:

Participate in placing the uncooked egg carefully into some warm water before it is cooked.

Help cut out egg shapes.

Help snip pieces of paper to decorate paper eggs.
