Project #833: Spiders!

- Cut out a large circle and a smaller circle from black or brown construction paper.
- Use the remainder of the paper to cut thin long strips of paper for the spider's legs.
- These leg shapes could also have slight bend at an angle to form the spider's leg shape.
- Children may glue the head and body shape together.
- Then they may glue 8 legs onto the spider's body. (spiders have 8 legs)
- Some children may glue more or less legs on and that is fine too.
- Add some googly or sticker eyes to the spiders head.
- Some children may like to draw the eyes and other facial features.
- Look at some photos or spiders in books or magazine to learn more about a spider's features
- Supply some textures such as some snip of wool to create the texture for the spider's body.
- Try painting the hand and making handprint spiders!

Song/Finger Play: "Incy Weensy Spider" with actions!

The incy weensy spider climbed up the water spout. (use hands and fingers to climb)

Down came the rain and washed to spider out, (use hands and fingers for the downward action)

Out came the sun and dried up all the rain. (Lift hands and fingers to dry the rain)

So the incy weensy spider climbed up the spout again! (use fingers to climb again)
