Project #834: Spider Webs!

- Provide some waxed paper.
- Gently drip liquid non toxic white glue to form your spider's webs shapes.
- Let this dry and when dry, it may be slowly peeled off the waxed paper. Or just place the web the waxed paper onto a window or a see through plate to view its details.
- Or you may like to try to draw a spider's web with a Qtip and white paint. Pre-cut Black paper in the basic web shape! A string dipped in white paint may also be used for this.
- Try making a web by gluing some white string to form a web.
- Use some spider web stamps for some of the younger children
- Try a colouring template of a spider's web. Children can add detail to this such as placing a spider shape or sticker onto the web.
- The web is used for the spider to catch other insects so you may like to add other insects into the web!

Spider walk: Act like a spider!
